The concept of '(r)evolution? lived histories 1945-1989-2022' is based on the archives of the Revolution Memorial and documents from the private collection of the Prin

Banat Association and proposes an interactive exhibition, which presents not only the spirit of the communist era in Romania and Eastern Europe, but also the interpretation by each visitor, in a personal way, of the revolutionary spirit of Timişoara. Created especially for younger generations, the exhibitions are a tribute to those who fought and sacrificed their lives for freedom and are intended to keep alive their memory and the events of December 1989.

Each room houses a particular stage of what communism meant in the Banat region: from the testimonies of deportees in the Bărăgan to images depicting the cult of personality of Nicolae Ceaușescu; from the resistance movements in the Banat to the Timisoara Proclamation and from a block administrator's notes on air raid exercises to notes on flatmates - who visited them and at what times, whether they turned off the lights, etc. The concept of '(r)evolution? lived histories 1945-1989-2022' was developed within the framework of the Moving Fireplaces cultural project, part of the Timişoara 2023 - European Capital of Culture.

Who do I go with?

In order not to forget our history and principles of life as citizens of a space that was fought for at the level of earning the right to be, I will go to these exhibitions with friends, parents, and children.

What do I get from this experience?

I will be left with an interactive experience, through which I can more easily access the memories of spaces, better understanding the context in which I grew up or in which future generations will develop.

Can I see from home or go another time? On an experiential level, we advise you to experience this moment live. The exhibition can be visited Monday to Friday from 8:00 - 16:00 and Saturday from 10:00 - 18:00.

Ritzi and Peter Jacobi are an artistic duo that represented a remarkable moment in the international avant-garde of the 1970s. "Experimental tapestry" is the form in which the two expressed their artistic vision, on the borderline between folklore and minimalist sculpture. The exhibition is a way of recovering artists originally from Romania, whose artistic path marks valuable moments in the history of recent art.

Who can I take with me?

Go with people interested in art, either relatives, friends or a partner. The exhibition is suitable for people of any age, regardless of their level of knowledge of art. Give yourself a relaxing weekend break and come and admire a duo that represented the Romanian Pavilion at the Venice Biennale in 1970.

What will I take with me?

The works on display give you an insight into the neoavant-garde of the 1970s. It is an opportunity to explore the sculptural field of "anti-form" proposed by the artists, and to discover elements strongly inspired by Romanian folklore. The exhibition raises issues of sculpture and spatiality, provoking visitors to dialogue and reflection.

RMN-GP On the occasion of the Timisoara 2023: European Capital of Culture event, the National Art Museum Timisoara hosts the exhibition Victor Brauner: Inventions and Magic, which brings together works from the Georges Pompidou Centre for Modern Art in Paris, as well as from national museums and private collections, in order to highlight the complexity and innovative nature of this artist's work.

A leading representative of the historical avant-garde, Victor Brauner's work was mainly international in scope, defining, along with other great artists such as Constantin Brâncuşi, the artistic styles of the early 20th century, such as Dadaism, Abstractionism, Expressionism and, not least, Surrealism, which became a prolific realm for his work.

Who can I take with me?

To access something magical and sublime, in an absolutely exceptional exhibition by a visionary Romanian who is remarkable in conception, creation, colour and vision, I will be browsing this exhibition with all those fascinated by art, from NFTs to classical art. Dedicated not necessarily to children but rather to teenagers, students, mature people and seniors, this exhibition is a gateway to a better understanding of this kind of surrealist art.

What do I get from this experience?

Brauner is a fascinating character who lived and created on the border between fact and fiction. The exhibition "Victor Brauner: Inventions and Magic" is a manifesto par excellence. as it brings to the attention of the Romanian public the work of Victor Brauner, who significantly marked the evolution of surrealism in the world, but who is less known in his native country. The exhibition is curated by Camille Morando, who is responsible for documenting works for the modern art collections at MNAM-CCI. Centre Pompidou. A professor at the École du Louvre (Paris), Ms Morando curated the monographic exhibition Victor Brauner, Je suis le rêve. Je suis l'inspiration, 2020, at the Musée d'Art Moderne in Paris.

Can I see it at home or go another time?

The most important Victor Brauner retrospective in Eastern Europe is a unique opportunity for visitors to discover the full range of the artist's work, still little known in his native country.

The EXTR-Activism exhibition presents artistic and activist positions that question and challenge the new commercial space race for mineral extractivism. It interrogates how the law has played a role in governing mining and extractivism across time and space, pushing the frontiers of resources across the globe. The exhibition is conceived and structured as an immersive performance, whereby visitors move as if aboard a pan-African spaceship, sending spacecraft to Mars tasked with stopping lunar and Martian colonialism and extractivism. During their journey, the afronauts rewrite the history and future of space exploration. Exposed to environmental atrocities and Anthropocene intervention in Earth mining, the afronauts have the opportunity to shape the future by witnessing an

alternate past. How can the governance of outer space be reimagined if the first person on the Moon was a Zambian Afronaut woman?

The fifth edition of the Art Encounters Biennial - My Rhino Is Not a Myth. Art science fiction - which will take place from 19 May to 16 July 2023 is dedicated to the intersection of art, science and fiction, exploring their potential to recover reality as a network of complex processes. Curated by Adrian Notz with a collective of young curators, this year's edition will run for eight weeks from 19 May to 16 July 2023, bringing together artists from 21 countries, including 11 with new works specially conceived for the event.

A first for the Art Encounters 2023 Biennale is an artistic extension at the National Museum of Contemporary Art in Bucharest, with the installation Black Cloud by the well-known Mexican artist Carlos Amorales. It is part of the new exhibition season of the National Museum of Contemporary Art and will be open until September.

The fifth edition of the Art Encounters Biennial takes place in a special year for Timisoara, which is European Capital of Culture in 2023.

You will have the opportunity to participate in an extremely intense and attractive programme, which will include guided tours with the invited artists and the curator of the biennial, a conference on the role of NFTs in cultural institutions and immersive art experiences with Auronda Scalera and Alfredo Cramerotti, performances by Arantxa Etcheverria and Anca Munteanu Rimnic, "Cyclops", a concert by Carlos Amorales, Enrique Arriaga and Philippe Eustachon, feat. Janiv Oron, tours with a tram populated by Carlos Amorales' well-known work Black Cloud, a picnic & informal talks with artists, meetings with artist run spaces in Timisoara (Avantpost, Balamuc, Baraka, Lapsus, Nava C2, Simultan), as well as the launch of the Art Encounters Biennial Catalogue at "La Două Bufnițe" Bookshop.

What do I get from this experience?

I will be going to these Art Encounters Biennial exhibitions with everyone interested in art and technology, but also with my whole family and friends. The mediation programme will allow me to visit the exhibitions with the children, as the artworks are interactive.

Why should I go?

> The exhibition is a visual journey through a novel. It starts from the first bildungsroman in the history of European literature that follows the story of a lesbian's becoming: "The Scorpion" (Der Skorpion), published by Anna Elisabet Weirauch (1887, Galati - 1970, Berlin) and aims to document the experiences of the present.

In 2023, the exhibition "Spotlight Heritage Timişoara - Parallel worlds", organized in the attic B2 of Maria Theresia Bastion, offers the public an insight into the history of neighborhoods through a baroque key: the allegory of senses, presenting sequences from the daily life of losefin (2019), Elisabetin (2020), Fabric (2021), Cetate (2022), and Giroc, a communist-era residential district.

In the attic of Theresia Bastion, cultural heritage assets from the collections of the National Museum of Banat will be displayed, illustrating the economic, social, and cultural life of the 5 neighborhoods in Timişoara, alongside various memory sources: fragments of interviews and literary texts (novels, journals, memoirs).
